**This is your final subject choice.** Your choices will be discussed with your parent(s) / guardian(s) and with your teachers at the **online parent-teacher meeting on 11th March 2021**.

In choosing your subjects you must consider the information in the **options prospectus** as well as the following:

- 1. All students <u>must</u> study Religious Education, English, Mathematics and a Science. All pupils will have non-exam PE on their timetable, though PE is also available as a GCSE Option.
- 2. English Literature is a mandatory subject for those choosing **Pathway 3**.
- 3. All students must study at least <u>one</u> Science. Those in Pathway 1 must choose Applied Science. Both Single Award Science and Applied Science count as one option / GCSE equivalent. Double Award Science counts as two options / GCSEs.
- 4. Only those choosing Pathway 2 or 3 can choose Double Award Science.
- 5. It is recommended that all students study a <u>language</u> other than English.
- 6. Pupils are likely to be in a new form class in Year 11 as this is based on which pathway they have chosen.


- You can only select one "IT" option the OCN NI Level 2 in IT **OR** GCSE Digital Technologies (Multimedia) **OR** GCSE Digital Technologies (Computing).
- You can only choose one "Food" option Occupational Studies Contemporary Cuisine or GCSE Food and nutrition.
- You can only choose either Travel and Tourism **OR** Geography.
- All subjects offered are GCSE unless marked as "Level 2" which have GCSE Equivalencies.
- Universities may not accept Occupational Studies as equivalent to a GCSE though they will consider it as part of your academic profile.




